








TYPE OF BEEF (EXCLUDING VEAL) PRODUCED AND CONSUMED IN FRANCE IN 2022



#### 2023-2027: Bovine coupled supports

Animal coupled supports have been modified with the CAP reform implemented in 2023, and the allocated budget decreases every year. The suckler cow support and the dairy cow support, that were previously paid per cow have been grouped into a unique bovine coupled support. The support for suckler calves production with a quality Label has been simplified.

#### Bovine coupled support - 672 M€ in 2024 (689 M€ in 2023)

This new support is given for animals older than 16 months and based on the number Livestock Units (LU), LU coefficients are: 0.6 III for animals from 16 to 24 months and 1 III for animal over 24 months old

Eliaible animals: cattle over 16 months old, males and females, kept for at least 6 months in the farm. The support is available from 5 LIGB

#### Payment conditions: this support is separated into 2 levels:

- higher level; for suckler females, up to twice the number of calves born on the farm over the previous 15 months (held for 90 days); and for males, within the limit of the number of eliaible cows (without any breed criteria).
- standard level; for dairy females, and for males and suckler females beyond the capping criteria (see beneath).

Capping: the total of eligible LUs is capped at a maximum corresponding to 1.4 times the available forage area ("density cap") and 120 LUs, with application of the French transparency for "GAEC" societies. Furthermore, only 40 LUs can be awarded at the standard level (with a guarantee of 40 eligible LUs, without application of the "density" cap).

#### Support for suckler calves production with a quality Label ("Label Rouge", Gl. Organic)

Eliaible animals: calves of suckler or mixed breeds (or resulting from a cross with one of these breeds) and produced under a quality scheme such as French "Label Rouge", Gl (Geographical indication) or Organic, slaughtered the previous year (excluding O and P conformations, and fattening level 1).
